

Pennsylvania is emerging as THE DECIDING BATTLEGROUND STATE in the 2020 election. The very partisan and detrimental House Resolution 1032, which could have endangered a free and fair election in our state, was stopped dead in its tracks last week, thanks to *your* efforts (phone calls to representatives).

The next big hurdle facing us is the likely unprecedented millions of mail-in ballots expected to flood county elections offices -- and county election officials are currently prevented from beginning to process any of them until Nov. 3. As a result, it could take many days after the election to finalize an accurate tally -- time which the Trump campaign will use to question the validity of the mail-in ballots and a potential Biden win.

For months, county officials, regardless of party affiliation, have pleaded for more flexibility to begin the process in advance. County officials across the state say the lack of pre-canvassing legislation is the number one issue standing in the way of a timely counting of votes.

What is pre-canvassing?

Pre-canvassing involves removing mail-in ballots from their envelopes, checking them for eligibility, and preparing them to be scanned. The ballots would not be scanned until Election Day.
